Tech Time

Need some one-on-one tech help? Bring your device (or use one of ours) and come prepared with a tech-related question or challenge you would like to explore with a savvy staff member.

Tech Time is divided into four 20-minute timeslots that you can sign up for upon arrival. If you do not get a timeslot, you may put your name down on a waiting list in case we are ahead of schedule.

Family Centre Drop-In Counselling

In-Person nêhiyawêwin (Cree Language) Classes - Canadian Native Friendship Centre
