Baby Laptime

Beyond Binary is open to all adults and teens 16+ who identify as women, queer and/or trans.

Artemis Spaceship Bridge Simulator - Boldly go where no one has gone before as you trek through the stars in the Artemis Spaceship Bridge Simulator, a cooperative multiplayer video game that lets players experience the thrill of controlling an interstellar vessel. Join a crew and help pilot your vessel through your neighbourhood galaxy quadrant! (Uniforms not required.)

Play with one of our pre-made characters or email us before the game and we'll help you create a new character. As an added bonus, all new players will also receive a free copy of the Basic Rules. Conversation Circle with Tough Enough To Talk About It

Join us on Monday September 11th for an opportunity to participate in a presentation from the Suicide Prevention Resource Centre: Tough Enough To Talk About It. Tough Enough to Talk About It, formerly the Men at Risk program, began in 1999 in response to a high percentage of suicide deaths in northern Alberta occurring in industry, trades and agriculture. Today we know that in Alberta three out of four deaths by suicide are male, with middle aged men being at highest risk. Tough Enough To Talk About It presenters will provide information on how to recognize the signs of distress and depression and offers tips for self-care. Join us in learning how to be "tough enough" to talk about mental health concerns, and how to support friends and co-workers to do the same. Light refreshments will be served. Seating is limited. Registration is appreciated but not required.

Topics for this session include: Operating systems (Windows, Mac) Internet Browsers (Explorer, Chrome, Firefox) Microsoft Office Suite (Word, Excel, Outlook) Commands, navigation, file management and folders, menu options and more... Sessions are facilitated by knowledgeable EPL staff members who will get participants started working through the available resources. They will be there to answer questions and guide self-directed learning.

Voices of Amiskwacyi - Digital Storytelling Workshops

Learn how to create your own digital story! You're invited to share your personal story with the assistance of the Voices of Amiskwacyi project team. Share your experiences, reflections, history, territory, culture and language or any topic that is important to you. Digital stories can be uploaded to Voices of Amiskwacyi - a digital public space to share Indigenous stories with Edmonton and the world. Your story can be in the form of text, video, sound, or image files. This program involves two separate workshops:

Part 1: Share Your Story - September 24th from noon to 2:00 p.m.

Introduction to the project, ethics, informed consent, copyright, gathering content, planning, storytelling examples and more

Part 2: Complete Your Story - October 15th from noon to 2:00 p.m.

Review of content, basic editing (either app or software), crediting sources, uploading finished product to Voices of Amiskwacyi, etc.
