Computer Skills: Introduction to Using Computers

Computer Skills: Introduction to Browsing and Searching the Internet

This is a class for those who are new to computers including English language learners and seniors. You will learn about what the internet is, how to use a web browser, and how to browse and search the internet. You should already know basic computer parts and terms, how to use a mouse and keyboard, and how to navigate Microsoft Windows. A laptop and mouse will be provided for this class. **NOTE: Registration Required. Register online or call 780-442-0888**

Cricut 101: Certification

This class enables customers to book appointments on Cricut machines at select EPL branches.
