Sing, Sign, Laugh and Learn

You and your child from birth to age three are invited to join us for songs, rhymes and signs! In this inclusive class, offered in collaboration with the Edmonton Early Intervention Program, parents/caregivers will interact one-on-one with their child while learning strategies to engage their child and enhance their child's communication and development through repetition, visuals and movement. Duration: 45 minutes. **Ages 0 - 3. NOTE: Registration Recommended**

Baby Laptime

Enjoy delightful stories, songs, books, rhymes, finger plays and more, especially for babies. Cuddle with your baby and connect with other caregivers. Duration: 30 minutes. **Ages 0 - 12 months. NOTE: Registration Recommended**

Baby Social Time

Come relax in a comfortable space where your baby can play and you can connect with other parents and caregivers. The library will have toys, books, and music for use during social time, but no structured programming is provided. Duration: 60 minutes. (Drop in any time!) **Ages 0 - 12 months.**

Preschool Read and Rhyme

Preschool Read and Rhyme gives children aged 4 to 5 the opportunity to interact with words and stories in a fun and stimulating environment. With stories, songs, rhymes, and movement, they will explore language and have fun! Parents may choose to participate or let their child attend solo; however, all parents must remain in the library for the duration of the class. Duration: 30 minutes. **Ages 4 - 5. NOTE: Registration recommended.**

Discovery Club

Full STEAM ahead! Explore all things Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math in this club for young scientists and makers. **Ages 6 - 8.**

Computer Skills: Introduction to Using Email

This is a class for those who are new to computers including English language learners and seniors. You will learn about sending and receiving emails, attaching files to an email, and email safety. You should already know basic computer parts and terms, how to use a mouse, how to type, how to launch a program in Microsoft Windows and how to navigate an internet browser. You may need a mobile phone in this class for verification upon email set up. The mobile phone is recommended but not required. **NOTE: Registration Required**

Computer Skills: Smartphones and Tablets

This is a class for those who are new to tablets and smartphones or are looking to become more confident using these devices, including English language learners and seniors. You will learn the basic differences between Apple and Android, how to navigate your device, what the different icons mean, how to find and adjust your settings, and what apps are and how to access them. No prior knowledge is required. Tablets will be provided. Bring your own device (smartphone and/or tablet) if you have one! **NOTE: Registration Required**
