Five Alberta authors vie for \$10,000 award

Voting for Alberta Readers' Choice Award begins May 1

EDMONTON, **AB**, **April 11**, **2012** – Albertans will have their say at the polls in May to award one of Alberta's richest literary prizes.

Now in its third year, the Alberta Readers' Choice (ARC) Award – presented annually by the Edmonton Public Library – underwent a facelift this year. The eligibility requirement changed from an Alberta-based publisher to an author residing in Alberta.

"This change makes EPL's ARC Award truly an Alberta award," said Linda Cook, CEO of the Edmonton Public Library. "We heard from many authors living in Alberta who were quite disappointed they were not eligible for the award because their books were published outside the province. The new eligibility recognizes the exceptional writing talent in Alberta and encourages readers to support Alberta authors."

The selection committee narrowed down a list of 10 titles to come up with the year's top five books:

- Fall From Grace by Wayne Arthurson, published by Forge Books
- Freddy's War by Judy Schultz, published by Brindle & Glass
- In the Suicide's Library by Tim Bowling, published by Gaspereau Press
- Nobody Cries at Bingo by Dawn Dumont, published by Thistledown Press
- The Antagonist by Lynn Coady, published by House of Anansi Press

"It was exciting to debate the long list, which has a lot of stimulating aspects," said Anna Marie Sewell, ARC Award jury member and Edmonton's Poet Laureate. "The list is a fascinating snapshot of the cultural moment here in Alberta."

From May 1 to 31, the public can go online at www.epl.ca/alberta-readers-choice to cast their votes. The winner of the 2012 ARC Award will be announced on June 9 at the 2012 Alberta Book Awards Gala in Calgary.
